Re: Service Ministry Report for September 21, 2023 Meeting

Celebrating the Season of Creation: What is the Season of Creation? From September 1 to October 4, the Christian family celebrates the good gift of creation. This is a global celebration which began in 1989 with the Orthodox Community celebrating a Day of Prayer for Creation which is now embraced by the wide Christian ecumenical community who come together through celebration, conversion and action for our common home. During the Season, we join with Christians around the world in prayer and action for our common home. What is the theme for the 2023 Season of Creation? The 2023 theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow" inspired by the words of the prophet Amos: "Let justice flow on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (5:24). In his message for the Season of Creation, Pope Francis comments that the image used by Amos speaks to us of what God desires: "God wants justice to reign; it is essential to our life as God's children as water is essential for our physical survival. When we maintain the right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water. Too many of our brothers and sisters are prevented from drinking from that mighty river. We are called to stand with victims of environmental and climate injustice and to put an end to the senseless war against creation."

How will ST. MARK participate? Prayers for Creation will be offered through intercessions at Mass. Individuals are encouraged to offer prayers for renewed respect and care for creation. The Clean Air Campaign will raise awareness about the effects of idling on in-car and outside air quality to reduce idling during school drop-offs and pick-ups. The Fall Festival will be more sustainable replacing water bottles with paper cups. Food scraps and biodegradable paper products will be collected for composting. Plastic pill bottles will be collected on September 30 and October 1 and be repurposed for use in medical facilities in poorer nations. The Blessing of Animals on the Memorial feast day of St. Francis of Assisi on October 4 will offer praise and gratitude to God for all created beings.

English as a Second Language (ESL) – ST. MARK ESL Program is still seeking Students and new Volunteers to participate in our upcoming in person for the Fall 2023 Term, Sept. 26–Dec. 5. Our goal is to "Welcome the Stranger" and provide a program where adults from all ethnic and religious backgrounds can come and learn English and acclimate better to life in the U.S. No experience is necessary to Volunteer. All classes take place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings for one and a half hours from Tuesday, September 26, until Tuesday, December 5. In addition to English language classes, St Mark is offering informal English Conversation, Writing, and Citizenship Preparation.

## **Religious Education Report for September 2023**

#### **CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION**

This summer's Vacation Bible School served about 40 preschool through grade 5 children with space-themed songs, stories, art, dance, and games to learn about God, our faith, scripture, and the saints. For summer 2024, VBS will have an underwater/scuba theme.

RE classes for 2023-24 began on September 10 and 11. Classes for preschool through grade 8 are offered Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:45 am in the CFC. An additional class section offered on Monday for grade 6 was canceled due to lack of enrollment, but one co-ed grade 8 class (4:30-5:45 pm) and one co-ed grade 7 class (6:30-7:45 pm) are meeting on Mondays in the CFC. Enrollment is currently 224 students in-person and 31 in a homeschool option that is coordinated with our RE Office.

#### **ADULT FAITH FORMATION**

Bible Study: RE Commission member Mark Morneau will be using the program entitled *Fulfilled: Uncovering the Biblical Foundations of Catholicism, Part Two – Drawn into the Divine Mystery,* to facilitate the next Bible Study. This study consists of seven sessions, each with a 30-minute video focused on elements of the inner sanctuary of the Tabernacle and how they connect to the Magisterium, the Eucharist, incense, Mary, and more. It will be held via Zoom on Wednesdays at 7:30 pm and Thursdays at 10 am starting October 4 and 5.

Sunday Adult Formation: Adult formation is being offered in-person on Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:45 am in the CFC gym, during the period of children's RE classes. Starting September 17, the Alpha Team is facilitating the Alpha program as one of the formation offerings. Additionally, there will be a rotating speaker series as a second offering; these talks will include:

September 24 – Dominican Sisters of St. Cecelia discussing their experience in religious life and answering "Silly Sister Questions" from participants

October 22 – CAINA presentation entitled *God and Science: Where Does the Evidence Lead?* exploring the scientific evidence of God's existence

October 29 – CAINA presentation entitled *Near-Death Experiences: Evidence of the Soul* on medical studies that reveal something of the reality of our soul, heaven, hell, and the afterlife

December 10 – CAINA presentation entitled *The Significance and Science of Our Lady of Guadalupe* covering the history of Mary's apparitions nearly 500 years ago and the results of modern scientific analysis performed on the relic cloak of St. Juan Diego

#### **SACRAMENTS**

Confirmation: The Diocese has given us a much earlier date than usual for our Confirmation Mass; it will be on Monday, March 11, 2024 with Bishop Burbidge presiding. For this year's 8<sup>th</sup> graders preparing for Confirmation then, a student and parent workshop was held on August 30 so families would learn about the upcoming year of formation and the Confirmation retreats. Fr. Pat, Joe Flaherty, Sarah Lundquist, and Kevin Flores spoke, and Kim Parker was present. Students met their Spirit Teams for the first time.

Baptisms: To engage young families in the life of the parish and help them make connections with one another, the Baptism Team is hosting a new series of events this year. The first quarterly *ST. MARK* Family Playdate was held on Saturday, September 16 morning on the ELC playground. Baptism Team members visited with three participating families, supplied Goldfish crackers, and arranged for a representative of SMCS and Alpha to share info about parish resources that may be of interest to young families.

#### **CLASS MASSES**

After the success of the inaugural Class Masses last spring, they return again but in the fall with the hope of drawing families into parish life sooner and with regularity. Two or three grades of students from SMCS and the RE program are invited to attend the same Sunday Mass together, and they gather afterwards for refreshments provided by their families. # **Worship/Liturgy Commission**

Worship Commission 9/11/2023

Meetings are held through Zoom. Attendance: Laura Cooman, Marjorie Brown, Jack Timmes, Barbara Saladino, Donna Mrozek, Pauline Hartnett, Susan Frizell, John Kuchenbrod, Maria Maldonado and Pam Burke

This was our first meeting since summer break.

**Children's Liturgy** - has resumed and this is for the 11:00 masses. 20 – 25 children attended this first one.

**Lectors** – There is a lector workshop scheduled for November 18. The lector schedule is complete through November. Possible suggestions to increase the numbers for lectors is to reach out to high school students for interest. That would be good for self-confidence and public speaking as well as help us.

**Liturgical Arts** – The current arras and plants are remaining on the altar through the Season of Creation. It is felt this best exemplifies the season as well as help the budget as the budget was decreased. Flowers will be

back Oct 7 weekend. Assessment of termite damage to the creche and rebuilding/repairing will begin after the fall festival. We also need to order the new wreaths for the church.

**Eucharistic Ministers** – The numbers of these ministers seem to be ok at that point. Some masses have more than others. There was quite a lengthy discussion about bringing back communion under both species. Other than the health risks associated with this as COVID numbers seem to be creeping back up, there is real concern about being able to have the Sacred Blood at all stations with the numbers of ministers available at each mass and the total of EM's. Maybe offer the Sacred Blood at two stations only? The medical professional in attendance is concerned that wiping the chalice and rotating may not really be sufficient to have it safe for others who take from the chalice.

**Ushers** – The number of ushers is low. There are not enough ushers to offer the option of an even and odd month team. Some masses really struggle to have the minimum. Again, recruit high school students? Helping with this ministry could serve as requisite service hours for some and perhaps cultivate ushers into adulthood? The 8:30 team has a high school student. Looking into CPR/AED training for ushers?

Altar Guild could use more help.

**Candle Team** – some of the candle stands are being moved out of their usual places on the altar and this is problematic as the candle holders really fit best into a particular stand. Both pieces are numbered to ensure the best placement after being processed or moved during the mass. Please use snuffers to extinguish flames, do not blow them out. Can always use more help.

**Choirs** – All adult choirs have restarted as well as the handbell choirs. There is no children's choir due to finding someone to lead these kids. There is a student who is playing piano at some of the 9:00 Sunday masses.

#### General updates:

- The sound system is still not complete. The sacristy speaker is not working and there are problems with
  the choir speaker. Sometimes the celebrant sounds muffled. The mic used by the cantor is not the one
  that was ordered with the system. Laura and Denise Argote are working with the vendor who is a bit
  unresponsive.
- Looking ahead to the Advent season and Christmas masses: This year is odd. The first Sunday of Advent is Sunday, December 3, not Thanksgiving weekend. The mass schedule for Christmas weekend is Saturday, Dec, 23 mass at 8 am and 5:30 pm. Sunday, Dec 24 masses at 9 am and 11 am as usual for Sunday. Then, Christmas Eve mass at 5 pm in the church, Activity Center, and Gym, then 8 pm and 10 pm in the church. Monday, Christmas Day masses are at 9 am and 11 am. That is a total of 11 masses over 3 days! There is great concern about 'staffing' all these masses.
- New carpet is going into the Narthex.
