4. School Update Gabriela Parks

- a. Student representatives at the Thomas Jefferson Intermediate Math Open: 35 schools participated.
   Teams with St. Mark students finished 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in different categories. The overall winning team had a St. Mark member.

Re: Service Ministry Report for October 19, 2023 Meeting

Celebrating the Season of Creation: From September 1 and concluding on October 4, the Christian family celebrated the good gift of creation. This global celebration began in 1989 with the Orthodox Community celebrating a Day of Prayer for Creation which is now embraced by the wide Christian ecumenical community who come together through celebration, conversion and action for our common home. During the Season, we joined with Christians around the world in prayer and action for our common home. The 2023 theme was "Let Justice and Peace Flow" inspired by the words of the prophet Amos: "Let justice flow on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (5:24). In his message for the Season of Creation, Pope Francis comments that the image used by Amos speaks to us of what God desires: "God wants justice to reign; it is essential to our life as God's children as water is essential for our physical survival. When we maintain the right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water.

St Mark's Participation: Prayers for Creation were offered through intercessions at Mass. Individuals offered prayers for renewed respect and care for creation. ◆ The Clean Air Campaign raised awareness about the effects of idling on in-car and outside air quality to reduce idling during school drop-offs and pick-ups. ◆ The Fall Festival was more sustainable replacing water bottles with paper cups. Food scraps and biodegradable paper products were collected for composting. ◆ Plastic pill bottles were collected the weekend of September 30 and October 1, to be repurposed for use in medical facilities in poorer nations. ◆ The Blessing of Animals on the Memorial feast day of St. Francis of Assisi was on October 4 as an offering of praise and gratitude to God for all created beings.

English as a Second Language (ESL) – ST. MARK ESL Program began on Sept. 26<sup>th</sup> and runs through Dec. 5. Our goal is to "Welcome the Stranger" and provide a program where adults from all ethnic and religious backgrounds can come and learn English and acclimate better to life in the U.S. All classes take place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings for one and a half hours from Tuesday, September 26, until Tuesday, December 5. In addition to English language classes, St Mark is offering informal English Conversation, Writing, and Citizenship Preparation.

# **Religious Education Report for October 2023**

#### **ADULT FAITH FORMATION**

Bible Study: As of October 4 and 5, the Bible Study is underway using the program entitled *Fulfilled: Uncovering the Biblical Foundations of Catholicism, Part Two – Drawn into the Divine Mystery.* This 7-session study facilitated by Mark Morneau is held via Zoom on Wednesdays at 7:30 pm and Thursdays at 10 am.

Sunday Adult Formation: Adult formation is being offered in-person on Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:45 am in the CFC gym, during the period of children's RE classes. The Alpha Team is facilitating the Alpha program as one of the formation offerings. DRE Joe Flaherty has organized a rotating speaker series as the second offering.

#### **CLASS MASSES**

This school year's Class Masses began with the pre-K, kindergarten, and first grade classes of RE and SMCS students and their families coming together at the 11:00 am Mass on October 1. They enjoyed the after-Mass social with families contributing refreshments and children playing both in the CFC gym and outside on the playground. The schedule continues:

#### **October 2023 Community Growth Report**

**Always Our Children (AOC):** The Always Our Children ministry continues Zoom meetings every other month, beginning this past September. Because of the AOC bulletin announcement for that meeting, I received calls from two former St. Mark parishioners, who have moved away but still check out our bulletin. They are both now in new parishes which do not have a support group of this kind. We are glad we were there when we were needed.

**Bakers for Funerals:** Baked for one very large funeral in the last month.

**Bereavement Program:** The fall Bereavement Program is going well with 10-12 attendees. The 1/2 day retreat is coming up on November 4, at Turner Farmhouse. Our Winter Grief Gathering is Sunday, Dec 10, from 3:39-5 pm at Turner Farmhouse.

**Book Club:** The seven session St. Mark Fall Bible Study of "Fulfilled: Discovering the Biblical Foundations of Catholicism, Part 2" began the week of October 8<sup>th</sup>. We have 27 participants across the two sessions.

The St. Mark Book Club is reading "**The Source**" by James Michener (it is an historical novel on the Holy Land). Because it is 1088 pages, we are reading it over September, October and November. We meet one each month to discuss the section we read for that month. We have 11 participants reading this book.

Care for Our Common Home Ministry (CCH): Fall Festival made more sustainable by avoiding plastic water bottles and composting paper cups. Our hope is to continue moving towards sustainability for all events at St. Mark like many of our fellow parishes.

The participant's are enjoying the Youth Alpha which has similar content but a revised format. The attendees include both new participant's as well as long-time Alpha followers.
